<u>Tell Me More</u>, produced by Auralog, is an online interactive language training tool which provides training in the languages of Dutch, English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, and Latin American Spanish. The purchase of <u>Tell Me More</u> was an APLEN initiative, funded by the Alberta government through the Public Library Development Initiative Fund (PLDI).

This language training tool is available to all public library members of the Shortgrass Library System (SLS). To use this tool go to the SLS web page <www.shortgrass.ca> and select *Search Online Resources* from the *Shortgrass Links* on the left hand side of the page. This will present you with a page of databases. <u>Tell Me More</u> is listed under *Educational Databases*. Click on either the Home or Library link to open the login page for <u>Tell Me More</u>.

<u>Tell Me More</u> requires the use of Microsoft Internet Explorer 5.0 or higher. It will not work with other types of browsers (like Firefox). Also, it is necessary to sign up for a no-cost account in order to access this software. This no-cost account is used by the software to track your progress and provide the appropriate level of training for your needs.

The web interface for this tool is available in several languages including Hungarian (Magyar), Turkish (Türkçe), Polish, Portuguese, Brazilian Portuguese, Korean, Chinese, Italian, Japanese, German, Dutch, Spanish, French, and English. So, individuals familiar with any of these languages can use the interface they are most comfortable with.

Tell Me More has advanced voice recognition and speech analysis tools to help you perfect your

pronunciation. For example, by using 3D animations the <u>Tell</u> <u>Me More</u> phonetic exercises makes it easier for you to visualize the appropriate intonation. Plus, <u>Tell Me More</u> has 37 different types of activities to help you stay engaged and actively learning.

Unicorn Workflow Tips - Keyboard Shortcuts

Solution There are many keyboard shortcuts that you can use in Workflows to quickly access certain functions.

For example in the Circulation module: Function key 4 (F4) will quickly access Item Search; Function key 5 (F5) will quickly access CheckOut; and, Function key 11(F11) plus Shift accesses the Modify User Wizard.

When you hold down the ALT key, you will see that various letters are underlined. Together, the underlined letter and the ALT key will let you quickly perform various tasks. For example, in Item Search enter your search terms and then hold down the ALT key and the letter "s" (at the same time) and the search will be performed. ALT plus the letter "c" will close the window. You can also hold down the ALT key and quickly choose the type of search you want to perform. ALT plus the letter "k" will choose the Keyword search. ALT plus the letter "b" will choose the Browse search.

For more information on Keyboard Shortcuts, look in the Help file. Use Function key 1 (F1) and then do a search for "Keyboard Shortcuts."

During the middle of October the RISE Team reviewed the proposals received in response to the Request for Proposal (RFP) and selected three offers to study in greater detail. Following these vendor presentations, the project entered the due diligence phase with the RISE Team evaluating the proposals and checking vendor references prior to making a recommendation to the directors of the Chinook Arch, Marigold and Shortgrass Library Systems. A vendor has now been selected and contract negotiations have commenced.

The RISE Consultant Librarians (Heather Sentes, Art Knight and Jim Dunbar) have also been working on the RISE Wiki, a 'one-stop-shop' video conferencing information site for the RISE libraries. This wiki is now available at <http://wikirise.pbwiki.com>. The wiki will be updated on an ongoing basis with programming ideas, professional articles, links to video conference web sites, the RISE Review, and other content related to video conferencing. The libraries participating in this project are encouraged to visit the wiki. They are also encouraged to add content to the wiki, as desired.
