Purpose: The Board supports the provision of free, open and non-filtered internet access for library patrons. Internet access is an everyday necessity for learning, social engagement, and civic participation.

- The Board supports the Canadian Federation of Library Association's "Access to Information and Communication Technology" position statement (2016) which asserts that Canadians have a right to universal, equitable and affordable access to robust information and communication technology networks; access to information literacy; open access to information; freedom of expression; and privacy.
- 2. The Library will provide equipment and space to ensure that patrons have adequate internet access to meet basic needs.
- 3. The Library will maintain administrative policies and procedures to effectively manage public internet access.
- 4. As per Board policy LM.2, "Confidentiality of User Records," no record of internet use by any individual will be provided to law enforcement or other public agencies without a court order requiring such provision.
