## message from the chief

2024 was a positive year for the library, as we made some significant improvements to our facility. With help from the City, we built a new washroom in the Kinsmen Children's Library and opened up the entrances to our existing upper floor washrooms. These changes have been transformative. Families now have everything they need in the safe. comfortable environment of the children's library.

It's worth mentioning the City also completed a major HVAC project in our building, replacing our boilers and otherwise upgrading our systems. We are lucky to be in a City facility and to have this sort of maintenance taken care of for us.

Our security guards have made a big contribution to the library. Their presence has reduced many of our behavioural challenges and freed up staff to concentrate on service. The guards have done an excellent job taking on our empathetic approach to enforcement. Each day I see them dealing with people with kindness and respect. I am especially happy to see children who are delighted to

are delighted to greet their favourite guard and get a sticker.

We receive many generous donations from our community, large and small, and we used them to accomplish some special things that we couldn't have otherwise. We were especially excited to receive the first of two mini study pods in 2024. We now have a soundproof pod that is good for quiet study, podcasting or music practice, and a larger pod for study or one-on-one meetings.

The Library Board worked hard on needs assessment in 2024, in preparation for a new Plan of Service to be released in 2025. They spoke to many people at community events and otherwise investigated what the library should do for the community. Libraries can do many

different things, and it is necessary to listen to the community and pick priorities that meet local needs.

## our patrons

There were 169,852 visits to the library, up from 159,709 in 2023.





**13,478** people have a library card.

**25,171** questions were answered at our desks, down from 26,568 in 2023.

## social work

Library social workers support community members of all backgrounds and life experiences. The team does everything from helping seniors navigate the paperwork they need to fill out as they transition to retirement or after the death of a partner, to helping low-income families and individuals access supports to achieve housing, food and income security.

As an entry point into the system of care in Medicine Hat, the library social work office is uniquely positioned to reach community members experiencing challenges meeting their needs. That includes helping people access emergency shelter supports and building social connections with our in-house programming.

Our social workers also facilitate the



Casual Cash Employment Program, a direct response to a demonstrated community need for a program that supports marginalized people. It provides job skills, short-term cash support, social integration and helps to build meaningful relationships across generations.

In the grant year April 1, 2024, to March 31, 2025, the social work office provided service to 376 unique individuals, averaging 46 interactions a month.




## staff & volunteers
